ATHENS, Greece





Ozon Magazine:

ArtWall :

The ArtWall is a gallery with a difference. Artists here work on the galleries interior surfaces, and are allowed to interpret the walls as an “intermediate space” for their work. The artWall reflects the contemporary artist who creates his/her own reality in combining infinite information and stimuli from the urban setting.


The multiple interior surfaces of the exhibition space refer us to the movie “The cube” by Vincenzo Natali (1997) in describing a complex structural system, a linear gateway to the next destination. Art creates infinite variables for the artist but also for visitors to go to pass on to the next state of mind.

The ArtWall in Athens brings together contemporary artists who produce ideas and projects – documenting concepts and images of the city, often contradictory to each other.



ASTY 68 :

Inspired by the urban landscape of Athens early last century, created an urban cafe, the Asty 68. Keeping the tradition, but with strong elements of classic architecture is adapted to the modern urban landscape and lifestyle. A place of assembly, communication and entertainment for all hours of the day, next to the railway lines. In the morning you can relax with Greek coffee on the coals and sweet preserves. Noon and late evening available fine dining and delicacies. Asty 68 place great emphasis on raw materials and their cuisine based on products of designated origin and organic products from producers across Greece.



Paul Sarz :

Paul Sarz is a jewellery designer based in Athens. Born and raised in Greece, the designer is inspired by this city and knows what it truly means to be an Athenian. He began designing jewellery from an early age and opened his first store in the centre of Athens in April 2010. This fabulous jeweller's shop is a showcase for the unique, and has an exclusive collection of pendants, rings and earrings which show influences from both the ancient world and the Victorian era, but still manage to look edgy and modern.



Six D.O.G.S :

1. Six d.o.g.s is a day and night cultural entertainment centre at the heart of Athens Monastiraki, which organically combines a project space for presenting visual art projects and one-off events with a bar. The bar launched in October 2009 and is an elongated dark space. All of the surfaces here have been painted completely black, with the only light source being a colourful Greek-Taverna style lamp structure hanging from the ceiling, at the very centre of the space. On a daily basis there are local DJs on circulation, playing mostly Indie music and it always opens from eight pm until the early hours of the morning.





STEFANIE'S STYLE DIARIES: FRANCE

BORDEAUX, France -

Bordeaux is a port city on the Garonne River in southwestern France. The city is the ninth largest in France and is known for being a metropolitan area and the world's major wine industry capital since the 8th century. It is home to the world's main wine fair, Vinexpo and the wine economy in this area takes around 14.5 billion euros each year. The historic part of the city is on the UNESCO World Heritage List as "an outstanding urban and architectural ensemble" of the 18th century. The Bordeaux region is tremendously attractive thanks to its wonderful architectural heritage, many cultural assets and, of course, world-class food and wine. Bernard Magrez therefore decided to create a holiday concept to showcase these unique charms : Bernard Magrez Luxury Wine Tourism. In addition to tailor-made escapades in the wine country, he offers other sorts of à la carte trips and discoveries, planned with good taste and refinement.

Bernard Magrez Luxury Wine Tourism -

Found all over the world, brightening up the finest tables and providing intense, aristocratic flavours, the centuries-old magic of the great growths is epitomised by Bernard Magrez's enthusiasm for the vineyards of Bordeaux. He invites Fashion One into the intimacy of his prestigious estates, where history is written according to the rhythm of the seasons: Bernard Magrez Luxury Wine Tourism, incoming agency created in 2008.

Seasoned travellers, tired of anonymous pre-packaged holidays, walk through the heavy, solemn doors of, Château Pape Clément, Château La Tour Carnet and Château Fombrauge and step centuries back in time.



Château Pape Clément -

Château Pape Clément in Bordeaux is ranked among the Grands Crus Classé for its red and white wines in the Classification of Graves wine of 1959. It is the oldest wine estate in Bordeaux, harvesting its 700th vintage in 2006. The winery and vineyards are located in the commune of Pessac, southwest of the city of Bordeaux.

This vineyard was given to Bertrand de Goth, a 13th-century Archbishop of Bordeaux who subsequently became Pope Clement V. He was a talented manager and successfully improved wine-making there. In the 19th century, Jean-Baptiste Clerc established the wine's modern reputation. Bernard Magrez purchased the estate in the 1980s, giving it a new impetus and making a name for himself by producing a superb great growth wine.

Proudly standing between the vineyard and the château, the delicate glasshouse built by Gustave Eiffel is a dynamic part of the estate.

Starting at dawn, the sun's rays diffract through the Pavillon du Prélat's lacelike stained glass while guests admire the beautiful view of the surrounding vineyard.

As evening approaches, the light from the ceiling lamp in turn illuminates chairs and immaculate white tablecloths with its iridescent reflections. This glass showcase is wonderful for tastings, brunches, dinners and seminars.





Château La Tour Carnet -

One of the oldest properties in the Médoc, La Tour Carnet's beautiful medieval tower houses, the treasures of troubadours, the spirit of Michel de Montaigne and La Boétie... and a majestic suite decorated in keeping with the château's history.

The château has enormous character and contemplates its 900 years of history in the water of the surrounding moat, only crossed by an elegant drawbridge.

Whether tasting the wine - a classified growth from the Haut Médoc appellation - or celebrating an annual literary prize, Château La Tour Carnet captivates both writers and fine wine enthusiasts.



Château Fombrauge -

This former Carthusian monastery retains something of its religious past. Beautifully-proportioned, Château Fombrauge has been a wine estate since the 16th century.

Since its acquisition by Bernard Magrez, it has hosted countless concerts and musicians-in-residence and the long halls regularly echo to the sound of the most famous Stradivarius. The perfectly-aligned vine rows stretch to the horizon like strings patiently waiting to vibrate under the vineyard workers' hands.

This synergy between man and nature led to the creation of one of the oldest grands crus classés in Saint-Emilion: Château Fombrauge. This heritage and the wine's unique flavour continue to be perpetuated.





Saint-Émilion -

Saint-Émilion's history goes back to prehistoric times and is a World Heritage site, with fascinating Romanesque churches and ruins stretching all along steep and narrow streets. The Romans planted vineyards in what was to become Saint-Émilion as early as the 2nd century. The town was named after the monk Émilion, a travelling confessor, who settled in a hermitage carved into the rock there in the 8th century. It was the monks who followed him that started up the commercial wine production in the area.





Last Tuesday Society -
